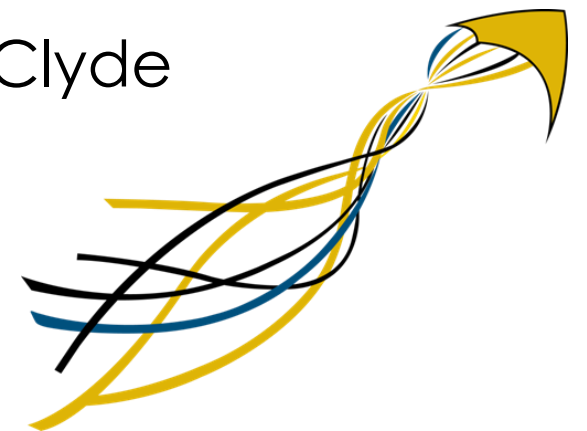

What's happening in school

- Revision:
 - Tutorial sessions:
 - Assembly / Well being activities / Independent Revision / Maths, English and Science
 - P5 – sign up forms to attend taught sessions on particular topics after school
 - Revision Drop ins
 - EPW – these lessons are now supervised Independent Revision – students to bring own resources
 - PE – now optional so students can choose to revise, but physical exercise is still very important
- 100 Hours Revision – relaunched in the run up to the Summer Exams
- Personalised Exam TTs & Exit TTs

Daily processes in school to help the exam process

- November and March Mocks – routines were practised to reduce stress in the Summer exams
 - Morning Greeting
 - Equipment out ready
 - Reminder that everyone has the right to enter their exams feeling calm and stress-free
 - Line up in exam location
 - Reminder of JCQ guidelines

JCQ Guidelines

- In external exams, if a phone rings, it has to be reported to JCQ and could result in disqualification.
- Unauthorised items:
 - Phones, watches, web-enabled devices must be switched off and left in bags or handed to invigilators.
 - Correction fluid
 - Gel pens
 - Calculator lids/cases
 - Written notes
 - Dictionaries

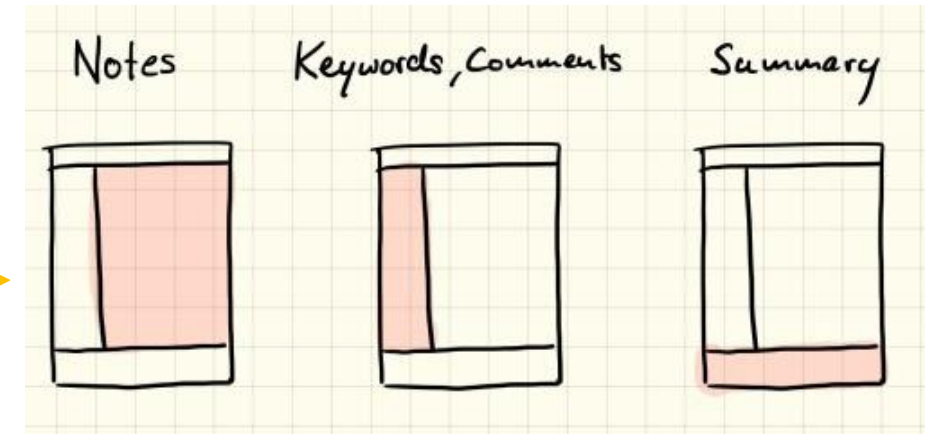

Maths

- The best way to revise maths is to do maths
- Use Revision Guides and Workbooks
- Work through Past Papers
- Websites:
 - Sparx – little and often
 - OnMaths
 - MyMaths
 - Maths Genie
- Period 5 sessions – Mon & Thurs after school
- Make sure you have a calculator that you are used to using



English Language and Literature

- Practise writing essays
- English Literature – know the texts: plot, characters, themes, useful quotations
- Attend Revision Sessions in school – after school Tues & Wed



Science

- Combined Science or Separate Science?
- Use Revision Guides and Workbooks
- Satchel:One – Accelerated Revision Sheets
- Websites:
 - Century – little and often
- Period 5 sessions – Mon (H), Tues (F) & Thurs (H&F) after school



How you can help at home

- Ensure your child attends school.
- Encourage them to attend Period 5 and Revision Sessions.
- Add key dates to family calendars.
- Be involved in revision sessions – test them and allow them to teach you!
- Support your child to stick to their Revision Timetable.
- Help them to have a quiet place to study and minimise distractions.
- Make sure they have breaks.
- Encourage good sleeping habits.
- Encourage exercise.
- Ensure they eat breakfast.
- Have tasty snacks, support and motivation on hand!
